Dawson, B. L. (2012- 2019) Development of an Organizational Diagnostic Project in PSYC 4669: Organizational Behavior. This was an ongoing service-learning project that I created with the help of a LIL grant from Fall 2011.

Status: Groups have surveyed and collected data from many organizations in the surrounding areas including: Bath and Bodyworks, Chick-fil-a, White County YMCA, UNG's Language Lab, Cabi, Back Porch Oyster Bar, TacoMac, Tommy Hilfiger, Residence Life on campus, Gainesville First United Methodist Church, Zaxby's and the NGCSU Bookstore and Intramural Sports division of NGCSU's campus to examine topics such as job analysis and pay satisfaction, motivation, engagement and turnover intentions. Students present the information to the class as well as their respective businesses along with recommendations and implications of the results.

Dawson, B. L. & Hatch, D. L. (2012-2016) Development of an Introduction to psychology supplemental podcast. system.

Status: Three podcasts have been recorded for Social, Developmental and Abnormal podcasts. Pretest-posttest data were collected during the Spring 2012 Semester. The assessments indicated that podcasts enhanced student learning in both the short term and long term, and the manuscript is being prepared for submission to the Teaching of Psychology journal.

Dawson, B. L. Bruster, M.*, Graves A.* Grey, A.* (2012-2016) Development of Career based podcasts for undergraduate psychology majors on campus.

Status: Starting in May 2012, I have enlisted several undergraduates to create and maintain an archival a podcast series covering specific fields within psychology as potential careers resources for students. Episodes range from interviews with Clinical, Social, Industrial Organizational, Cognitive, and Military Psychologists to understanding and discussing validity as a research construct, proper use of APA format and include several podcasts about applying to graduate school as well as adjusting to life in graduate school. Currently, the podcasts have been integrated into the Psych 1102 course as resources to aid students in understanding their career choices in psychology. In Spring 2013 we conducted assessments of the usefulness of the podcasts and objective knowledge gained for undergraduate students. The results of these assessments were published in a Society for Teaching Psychology E-book in 2014.
